

WHAT TO DO IF ICE* COMES TO YOUR DOOR

*(Immigrations Customs Enforcement)



DO NOT OPEN DOORS

ICE cannot come in without a signed warrant by a criminal court judge listing the date, time, address, specifics of what and where they can search. ICE has the ability to issue their own arrest warrant naming a specific individual. However, we are not legally required to give them access to our buildings nor give them any information about the person named on the warrant.



REMAIN SILENT

ICE can use anything you say against you in your immigration case, so claim your right to stay silent. Say "I plead the fifth amendment and choose to remain silent." Staff, say "We do not disclose information about our tenants."



DO NOT SIGN

Don't sign anything ICE gives you without talking to an attorney. You may ask for an attorney to explore all options to fight your case (see phone # below). WALK AWAY if you are not being detained. Do not run.



REPORT AND RECORD

Identify staff of their presence immediately. Report the incident to our local Rapid Response Network at (415) 200-1548. Take note of badge numbers, number of agents, date and time, type of car, and so on.

YOU ARE NOT ALONE. WE ARE HERE TO HELP.

It is our general policy to not cooperate with ICE Officers. Please be advised that ICE Officers are known to break the law and lie/try to intimidate people into cooperating; however, if you follow the above instructions you are not breaking any laws yourself.
