

BOBBY McFERRIN


For decades, vocalist, conductor, composer, **Bobby McFerrin** has broken all the rules, blurring the distinction between pop music and fine art, goofing around barefoot in the world's finest concert halls, exploring uncharted vocal territory, inspiring a whole new generation of a cappella singers and the beatbox movement. He is an inspiration to singers around the world who celebrate his innovative technique and spirit. His solo performances and collaborations with great artists—including Yo-Yo Ma, Chick Corea, and the Vienna Philharmonic—are the stuff of legend. Along the way, there were 10 Grammy Awards and a #1 global hit "Don't Worry, Be Happy."

Bobby first developed Circlesongs in his now legendary solo a cappella performances, when he needed other voices to help manifest his musical ideas. He gave the audience parts to sing, layering harmonies and rhythms, using call and response, conducting and composing his spontaneous inventions. During his years of worldwide touring, he evolved a variety of vocal groups beginning in the '80's with his Bay Area based group Voicestra, including original member David Worm and joined in this concert by Bryan Dyer, Destani Wolf, and Tammi Brown, a diversely gifted team of highly imaginative a cappella singers. Bobby has recently moved back to San Francisco from Philadelphia and is really excited to begin to create Circlesongs with everyone.

FANTASTIC NEGRITO

When you listen to **Fantastic Negrito**, you're invited to hear the story of life after destruction. Each song is a real story about a musician from Oakland who experienced the highs of a million-dollar record deal, the lows of a near fatal car accident that left him in a coma, and is now in the midst of a rebirth that took him from the streets of Oakland to the world stage. The narrative of this man is as important as the sound, because the narrative is the sound. Songs born from a long hard life channeled through black roots music. Slide guitar, drums, piano. Urgent, desperate, edgy.

Negrito burst onto the national radar by winning the inaugural NPR Tiny Desk contest in 2015, and has since won Grammys for all three of his albums. His latest singles are "Root City," an anthem for the Oakland Roots Sports Club, and "Rolling Through California", a rallying cry that calls for collective action in the wake of drought, accelerating climate change, and the growing calamity of California's annual fire season.





GLIDE ENSEMBLE AND CHANGE BAND, UNDER THE DIRECTION OF VERNON BUSH

It all began on Christmas Day in 1966. There were only 10 performers singing and playing some good soul-stirring music. Music that makes you dance, sing, shout, cry, and laugh. Music that moves you to your soul. Over the years, the **GLIDE Ensemble and Change Band** has transformed in many ways and continues to inspire many generations from past to present with its illustrious and powerful musical leaders: Faith Winthrop, Donnell Hickman, John F. Turk, Jr., and Ronald Sutherland. With the recent passing this year of our beloved band leader, Clifford Coulter, we pay special tribute to him and to all who have contributed to the tapestry of this music. It is through our long history and deep personal relationship with our own unique style of music that we are able to continue to move forward and thrive. It's been the lifeblood and healing balm of this church and organization, music which we have been able to share with our past notable performers, including Sammy Davis Jr., Leonard Bernstein, Marvin Gaye, Bono, Maya Angelou, Michael Franti, Lisa Fischer, Sheila E, India Arie, Goapele, Joan Baez and many more.

Since the start of the pandemic in March 2020, **Vernon Bush's** steady leadership has kept the GLIDE Ensemble energized by coming together and recharging on a consistent, weekly basis through Zoom, Sunday Celebrations, and limited outdoor performances. He has viewed his role as a way to make deeper connections and as a way to keep constantly encouraging and inspiring others through these challenging times. The Ensemble practices the improvisational art of staying present and true to the moment. With our honored musical guests, Bobby McFerrin and Fantastic Negrito, it's a perfect union to lift our voices and celebrate live together for the Ensemble, the Change Band and GLIDE! Yet another testament to our resilience. Yes, we rise!

Tonight represents the first full public performance of the GLIDE Ensemble and Change Band since the pandemic began.


KAREN HANRAHAN

Ms. Hanrahan is an alumna of Harvard Business School, University of Washington School of Law and The American University School of International Service.






MARVIN K. WHITE

Marvin K. White is GLIDE Memorial Church's Minister of Celebration. He is a graduate of The Pacific School of Religion, where he earned a MDiv. He is the author of four collections of poetry: Our Name Be Witness; Status; and the two Lammy-nominated collections, Last Rights and Nothin' Ugly Fly. In 2019 he was named one of YBCA's "100" for artists, leaders, activists, thinkers, movers, and dreamers who are using their creative and political power to enact change. Currently, he is a Kennedy Center Citizen Artist Fellow for 2020-2021. He is articulating a virtual and real-time vision of social, spiritual, and creative justice through his work as a public theologian, poet, and spiritual abolitionist.

MICHAEL TATE AUCTIONEER

A San Francisco resident since 1998, Michael Tate is an inspired and inspiring auctioneer with a demeanor that endears him to diverse audiences. He is unabashedly passionate in his commitment to helping nonprofits achieve their goals. RENEL BROOKS-MOON MISTRESS OF CEREMONIES

Renel Brooks-Moon is a Bay Area native, entering her 22nd season as P.A. Announcer for the San Francisco Giants. She is a graduate of Woodside High School, and received a B.A. in English Literature from Mills College. She spent 35 years as a local radio and television broadcaster, including stints at 106 KMEL, 98.1 KISS-FM and CBS-5, among others. Renel has been recognized by the Baseball Hall of Fame as the first woman to Public Address Announce a world championship game in any professional sport, following Game 3 of the 2002 World Series.

Renel has received numerous awards, including honors from American Women in Radio and Television, Multi-Ethnic Sports Hall of Fame, 100 Black Women, Bay Area Black Journalists Association and Girls, Inc. Renel was a founding member of Friends of Faith, a non-profit that served low-income Bay Area breast cancer patients. March 18, 2005 was proclaimed "Renel Brooks-Moon Day" in San Francisco by Mayor Gavin Newsom, honoring her broadcasting career and community activism. Renel was profiled in O, The Oprah Winfrey Magazine, as "The Woman Who's Changing Baseball". In 2008, Renel received an honorary doctorate from her Alma Mater, Mills College, and in 2018 she received an honorary doctorate from the University of San Francisco and delivered the commencement address. Also in 2008, Renel was the featured bobblehead for the Giants African-American Heritage Night, and in 2020 she served as Ambassador for the annual Giant Race, and was again the featured bobblehead.

In 2017, Renel was honored to MC the historic inauguration of San Francisco's first African-American Female Mayor, London Breed. Renel is a 2019 NorCal Emmy Award winner as host of the television series "Forever Giants", and was featured on a limited edition 2020 TOPPS baseball card. Renel has been mistress of ceremonies at the GLIDE Holiday Jam for over 30 years.

The 2021 GLIDE Annual Holiday Jam: Still We Rise, is dedicated to **Janice Mirikitani**, whose activism helped define the social justice culture of San Francisco, and whose renowned verse illuminated her struggles with ethnic identity and personal adversity.

Janice was a teacher, artist, and activist who worked tirelessly to empower and amplify the voices of the most marginalized communities. Her commitment to this work transformed tens of thousands of lives in San Francisco and beyond. As Co-Founder of the GLIDE Foundation, she played a seminal role in creating what many consider the nation's boldest and most unique fusion of social justice activism, social services, and the celebration of human creativity, all converging to break through traditional lines of race, gender, class, and creed.

Janice was always a driving force behind the GLIDE Holiday Jam, founding the fundraiser in the mid-eighties. Over the next 30+ years she forged strong and lasting connections with world-class artists and performers, and spearheaded fundraising efforts to support GLIDE.

Earlier this year, Janice worked with the Holiday Jam planning team to conceptualize the 2021 event and determine our theme. Still We Rise, evokes a sense of perseverance and renewal as GLIDE moves beyond the pandemic and into an era of bold new solutions that will reach more people in need, change systems and transform lives. Still We Rise encapsulates the poetic spirit shared by both Janice Mirikitani and Maya Angelou, who is the inspiration behind the words themselves. Tonight, we celebrate the artistry and enduring impact of Janice, and we commit to advancing her legacy by driving GLIDE forward with vision and determination. Join us.

Our city faces a crisis of homelessness and poverty that is spinning out of control as a result of systemic racial injustice and entrenched economic inequity – all exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 2020–21 pandemic year marked a turning point for GLIDE and San Francisco. We adapted to new ways of providing services and building relationships with those we serve. We also saw that bold solutions - like sheltering unhoused people in hotels and providing economic support for families - can help stabilize lives even in the midst of a global crisis. We learned that we can rebuild society with the goal of greater equity at the core.
